Chart 1 shows the daily average amount of time the students of this school spend on different after-class activities. The students put most of their time — 93 minutes — into doing their homework, and next in line is watching TV, which takes up 46 minutes. They put in about the same amount of time listening to music each. While 25 minutes is spent on sports, only 12 minutes goes into housework.

As is shown in Chart 2, only 10% of the time is spent on sports activities. I think this school should encourage the students to do more exercise after class. In that way, they may be healthier and more energetic.

Finally, group study rooms, our microfilm collection, and the multimedia center are located on level four.

Undergraduate students can check out up to ten books for two weeks. Graduate students can check out twenty books for four weeks. Books can be renewed up to two times. There is a 50-cent-a-day late fee for overdue books up to a maximum of \$15.00. Periodicals and reference books cannot be checked out.

The library is open weekdays, 8:00 a. m. to 10:00 p. m., and on Saturdays from 9:00 a. m. to 8:30 p. m. The library is closed on Sundays.
